FROM THE DIRECTORS



In this newsletter, we inform you about the research and activities in the CAMP network for the first term of 2021. Since January 2021, the network has published seven papers and four working papers, as well as two forthcoming papers. Due to Covid-19, onsite conferences and events have been canceled, but CAMP researchers have still been present in the virtual academic world. Thanks to everyone who has contributed so far in 2021.

<u>Blog</u>: In the first term of 2021, we have published 12 blog posts about publications and the FNI index. You can read more and follow the blog **here**.

<u>FNI index</u>: Already in February 2020, the FNI alarmed that we had tough times ahead. The index captured the development in the business cycle, but we observed that the uncertainty in the estimates increased. Therefore, we have now updated the algorithms we use to update the FNI index. This entails that the historical observations change somewhat but the broader picture remains. Our tests shows that the updated version is better at capturing the variation in the Norwegian economy than the previous version was. Read more about the FNI index on our **blog**.
